<u>Skill Work:</u> We are busy in ELA! We are working this week on using relative adverbs and relative pronouns in sentences. We are also working on a new informative/explanatory essay. This one is independent, so the students get to choose their own topics! Our centers are focusing on relatives, the essay, our spelling/vocabulary words, and writing mechanics. This Friday we have our SPELLING test. If the tictac-toe is not the right fit for studying these words, send Miss Brown an email for alternate activities (writing the words three times each night is a great alternate to the tic-tac-toe). Next week is a short week--we WILL have a vocabulary test on Wednesday, so we don't get behind in the curriculum. Next week's homework will ONLY be a shortened tic-tac-toe to prepare students for the vocabulary test. Students will only have to complete two activities in preparation for the test next Wednesday.

If a meal application is not processed for your child(ren) by the deadline date, September 18th; on September 19th, your child(ren) will have to pay full price for lunch; \$2.25 for elementary and middle schools, and \$2.50 for high schools.
